Internet of Things (IoT) is evolving continuously and we can define it also as Internet of everything. Blockchain is a decentralized technology or distributed approach on which transactions are anonymously recorded. Blockchain is a special self-maintaining database. Each entity in IoT networking can use blockchain services. Blockchain crosses jurisdictional boundaries as the nodes on a blockchain can be located anywhere on the planet. This might rise numerous and complex jurisdictional issues which ask for careful consideration in relation to the relevant contractual relationships.
