Students who present at conferences also have chance to practice their public speaking skills and professionalism, while building their professional network of peers and leaders already in the field.

All student submissions must represent a student's individual or student team research contribution—neither supervisors, industry mentors or faculty are allowed to be the primary presenter. The research must have been completed while the a undergraduate or graduate student. If a team research project is being presented at least one author of the research must attend the conference and present the research.

This special track will provide both undergraduate and graduate student the opportunity to orally present their research and obtain feedback on their work, while building their professional network.
